Religious Education (RE) Newsletter

Why is RE important?

The teaching of Religious Education is part of the national curriculum for all pupils and is taught using a syllabus agreed on for all Derbyshire schools. This ensures that all children become aware of the different faiths and non-religious views of the world, gaining knowledge about each one and discussing and responding to differences in a respectful way.

What do the children learn?

All learning is taken from the Derbyshire and Derby City Agreed Syllabus and Understanding Christianity Scheme

EYFS

The children learn about what is important to them and their family, thinking about special celebrations, such as birthdays. The children also start to think about the world around them beginning their understanding of respecting others differences. They also start to learn about key Christian celebrations and special stories and places.

KS1

The children learn about other world faiths in Y1 and Y2, Y1 has a focus on Judaism and Y2 focus on Islam. They also learn about key Christian celebrations and their importance. There is a separate unit for each half term and the children have weekly lessons. During all blocks of work the children learn about tolerance and respect.

How to help at home
